Bare Bottom Quilts

You're thinking about those cute little baby pictures, aren't you?

I think it's just an awfully cute name that a friend of mine has given to her (stacks) of quilt tops. What resonates most is that this truly is a better definition of those un-quilted tops; their supposed to be quilts when they grow up.

She's made the commitment to help them along by purchasing the new **BERNINA** quilt frame - which was designed to accommodate ANY brand machine. Because of space, she's set it up at the 5 foot length, but it comes with all the hardware to set up at 10 feet for those that can. She's also added the laser tracking light which allows her to trace any pattern instead of free-braining it.

The Quilt CAD software program that's available lets you design your quilt in its entirety on screen using pre-made patterns, or you can design your own. Print out the design on paper and use this to trace with the laser light. Of course this program can be used to design your layouts for any kind of quilting - hand, machine in cabinet, or machine on frame.

If you truly want to feel confident, there is a template set available that uses a stylus which runs in pre-made tracks. You can alter the spacing by moving the stylus along its grooved holder. The templates have 2 sides; 8 patterns in all.

Some of the special features of the **BERNINA** quilt frame - besides its sleek look - is excellent wobble-free control with the smoothness and accuracy of a professional system. This is obtained by eight extra-large bearings mounted in a unique angled position. The ratcheted take-up rail system gives you precise increments of control while advancing the fabric. And the leader clothes (which Velcro onto the poles) have pre-printed grid-lines to help you load the quilt straight. Completely adjustable height, a useful storage shelf and the ability to work from either side all make this an unsurpassed home-usage frame.

My room doesn't allow for a frame so I just got my brand new **Koala** cabinets with an extra large opening to hold my **Bernina 830** (New Generation). These are truly the finest sewing cabinets I've ever seen, and the super great news is that they're now being made in the USA.

Now I just need to make some new tops....

Top Tips

We have a store proverb: "No deadline, No commitment". Notice how you'll manage to find a way to get that wedding quilt or baby blanket or even most of the Christmas presents done on time - but you still haven't finished a quilt you started 5 years ago? The problem isn't inspiration, the problem is not having a deadline. Put some goal dates on your calendar and try to plan them with an incentive to make them stick. When you have a deadline (like this newsletter) you are more likely to make the commitment.

FOOT-STEPS

#83 THE CIRCULAR SEWING ATTACHMENT

Remember "Spira-graph"? Making all sorts of cool designs by turning a colored pen inside a tiny hole inside a set of cogged templates?? Or possibly you remember watching your kids having a blast playing with this pre-computer toy. Whatever the case, most of us were fascinated by the types of designs that would surprisingly appear. Working with the Circular Sewing Attachment is akin to that play-time.

Basically this is a tool you can use to make perfect circles; so even if you don't want to get funky you can use it with a simple straight stitch in order to make quick cathedral windows and the like. You could also use it as a way to mark and baste circles that you are going to turn under and appliqué. But when you start playing with some of your decorative stitches that's when the fun really begins.

If you're working on regular weight cottons it will be best to use a stabilizer on the back, preferably with a built-in adhesive. Put an embroidery thread in the top and a suitable bobbin-weight thread in the bobbin. The attachment secures to the machine bed with a single screw and you can use any of the feet appropriate for the type of work to be done (embroidery feet such as #6, #20 or #39 would be best for decorative stitches). Press the fabric onto the very sharp pin that sticks up, choose a fancy stitch and GO. It is really that simple.

You can alter the size of the circles or make concentric circles by sliding the pin along the notched rail (it will click when in place). Try playing with overlapping circles by lifting the fabric off the pin and repositioning it in a different spot. (There is a rubber cover to place on the pin so you don't bleed allover your project:-)

For some it will seem un-nerving if the last stitch pattern does not end completely when it meets the starting stitch. Here are some tips for that inevitability. First - on scrap fabric - try the stitch you want at different notches and see which ones work best. Second, consider using a stitch that has a shorter 'repeat' or decrease/increase the length until it fits correctly. Another option is to work semicircles off the edge of the fabric so joining never really comes into play. And, there always is the option of using a decorative embellishment such as a button or beads to hide any joins you're not happy with.

Bring out your inner child and spiral your way to creative expression!
