### Welcome to Our 20th Year

When we opened our doors mid-December...in 1997, the landscape was a lot different. The Wild Plum - a locally owned restaurant - was our favorite quick meal at the corner of Progress and Biddle...now a razed lot, but for many years in between - a Marie Callender's.

The third Cantwell's Market had just opened before Thanksgiving in their new building which now houses La Clinica. I imagine there are many of you that don't recognize that name, so for clarification, Cantwell's original grocery store was in Ashland, and you can think of it as similar to Market of Choice. They had later opened a second store on the south side, near The Manor. Unfortunately this last venture put their resources over the top and they closed it up...Easter Sunday...approximately 6 months after opening.

That first year was marked at every Holiday it seems; for that Labor Day 15,000 sq. ft. of (former) groceries was replaced by porn. So started my losing (but educational) battle with zoning legislation.... But I did eventually get to see that business go (somewhere else) too.

What is now the Hampton Inn were the homes and yards of several single family lots on Morrow. In fact, originally that drive for DQ did not connect with the drive for our lot. What is now called FedEx Office was originally Kinko's, then it was FedEx Kinko's. (Every time they changed their name they denied us space on the street sign, making us harder to find.)

Fabric stores were also different. JoAnn's was inside the R.V. Mall (before they bought out Fabricland for their current location) but more noteworthy were the two independent quilt shops: Rosebud downtown and Calico Junction at the Country Village. We were so impressed with them both that we decided to specialize in fashion fabrics when we brought our BERNINA store here: wools, linens, silks, rayons, knits. In 2003, after much customer urging, we re-worked our inventory from garment to quilt cottons. Jeanette's opened soon after in Phoenix. Meanwhile Quiltz had opened in Ashland, changing hands along the way. Fabric of Vision opened next to Allyson's (thankfully we still have the Kitchen Company). I also remember well Grandma Dee's huge undertaking and the compact Oregon Trail Quilts (originally The Purple Pincushion in G.P.).

It is so funny to think of ourselves as the old timers (and I'm not saying there aren't those even older-timier), but here we are in 2017, starting our 20th year in Medford! And at the exact same location. We're very proud of that. We have always worked hard to take care of the people who invest their trust with us, and especially for those making the long-term choice of buying a sewing machine. You've kept us in business and we're still in business for you. Thank you. And please help us continue on by recommending us to your friends.

### In the Works: A Year to Sew

If you are wondering where the Club classes have gone – those things I usually post on this page - well my short answer is, "I'm taking a sabbatical."

After six years of presenting 20 (*unique*) classes per annum, or essentially a brand new class every two weeks, I'm taking a year off to sew for myself. Not that I won't still be working my normal days at the store, nor periodically making a quick sample from pattern, but my so called 'days off' will be focused on enjoying my artistic expression in all its forms instead of preparing to teach.

Part of what lead to this decision was receiving word last spring that the Britt Festival has chosen me to create their fine art poster for 2018 (an annual tradition). I had answered their call for artist entries with my portfolio of art quilts, and they were thrilled at the idea to have their very first textile art piece. The completed quilt will be unveiled next spring (2018) and they will have posters for sale throughout that season. It should go without saying that I am both honored and excited. The hard part has been keeping it under my hat for so long!

My past quilts have taken 3 - 9 months, depending on the size, so I expect this one will take about 4 - 6. And once I get started, with the way I work in my painterly mode, the sewing room will soon be - by best description - a swamp of fabric covering every flat (or close to flat) surface. (For example: Is that a cat under there???) Once I started thinking of the logistics, of having to straighten up for more structured work, and of constantly thinking about the art I would rather be working on, I came to the conclusion that everyone would be best served if I gave up the clubs for awhile.

In the time I've had to reflect on these developments I've been trying to think of a way I can share the "Britt Quilt" experience with our Top Stitch friends. Since the project still hasn't quite taken shape, I'm still not sure how I'll be going about that. For the final effect - so that the unveiling ceremony is truly a Britt event - I am contractually prohibited from revealing too much of the project ahead of time. Think "trailers only".... So for the time being, if you are one of those who would like to stay in the loop (...and it may be loopy;-), please send me an email letting me know. (topstitch@qwestoffice.net) I will be keeping a separate list from our normal store postings specifically to keep those who are interested up-to-date.

And yes, I know there are many of you thinking (maybe screaming), "Just do Face-Book."
