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They say it was April 22, 1970. That tells me the exact date I first opened a business. I would have been 9. And I was determined to raise money to save the

planet. Opening the time-honored lemon-aide stand at the corner park, I was thrilled to come up with nearly \$5 (though I wonder now if that covered the cost of goods mom put in). The following year I would clean up the creek with my buddies (sign of the times - I was only one of two girls willing to wade into the dump). Nearly half a century later I have always been a committed environmentalist, and my life and business choices have held that as a foundational value throughout.

For instance, in Bellingham, WA, our first **Top Stitch** got front page headlines (local) when we brought in organically grown hemp fabric - in 1995! (It's tough being ahead of the curve; most people ended up buying \$3 per yard cotton muslin.) In Medford we've been offering organic cottons and thread since they first became available. And we've always assumed you don't really need another bag for that small piece of fabric you just bought. Small acts multiplied thousands-fold do make big changes...isn't that how we build a quilt?

In fact part of the reason we are so proud to sell **BERNINA** machines is because of their Swiss commitment to environmental consciousness, which is evidenced by the quality standards they continue to demand of their equipment. This family business is still thinking of long wear, with repair. I know of no other company that makes their walking foot repairable, or will refurbish circuit boards from 1987. Keep things longer? Presser feet bought in 1998 will still fit new machines today! It's a philosophy that was common in another era, and thankfully not entirely lost.

Today I plan to make waterproof sleeves for stainless steel straws so that I can carry them in my purse and skip the plastic ones. (Spoiler alert on the Christmas presents :-) I'll be using an eco-friendly waterproof cotton that we started carrying last year, which I've already used to make reusable lunch bags and aprons.

As I sit here typing and sunning this Earth Day, rejoicing in a gorgeous afternoon accompanied by bird chirps and wind chimes, I ask you all to start remembering that **every** day is our Earth's day. It is without a doubt our one and only home.

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The More You Know:

The United States EPA recommends that you turn off your engine when parked for more than 30 seconds.

I feel lucky that my artistic talent was recognized by family and teachers early on. I was constantly encouraged to draw and color and try all sorts of craft projects. They obviously saw a joy in me when I was occupied in these concentrations, and observed the sense of self-value learned in producing something I made. Most my attempts were self taught, reading from a magazine or exploring the hobby shop, which helped to develop problem solving skills and a general sense of creative daring. I know I am an artist because I feel compelled to do these things; there is no other way to phrase it.

It saddens me that education today has lost site of the value of arts. The obsession with tech and finance and finding a job has left little room for humanities in the class (though ironically it seems the new living standard is an endless stream of entertainment). But it goes without saying we call them the Humanities for an obvious reason. One could say we would not be human without them. (I recommend the book **How Art Made the World** by Nigel Spivey for more on this.)

So I have to ask, is this why our societies seem to be crumbling? Have we forgotten the basics to health and happiness because of an insatiable focus on wealth? Have we lost sight of our ability - and need - to personally contribute? Do we no longer value creation because of obsession with destruction? Will our steeple ever rise again?

I obviously have no answers...but I'll be searching for some sanity in my sewing studio.
