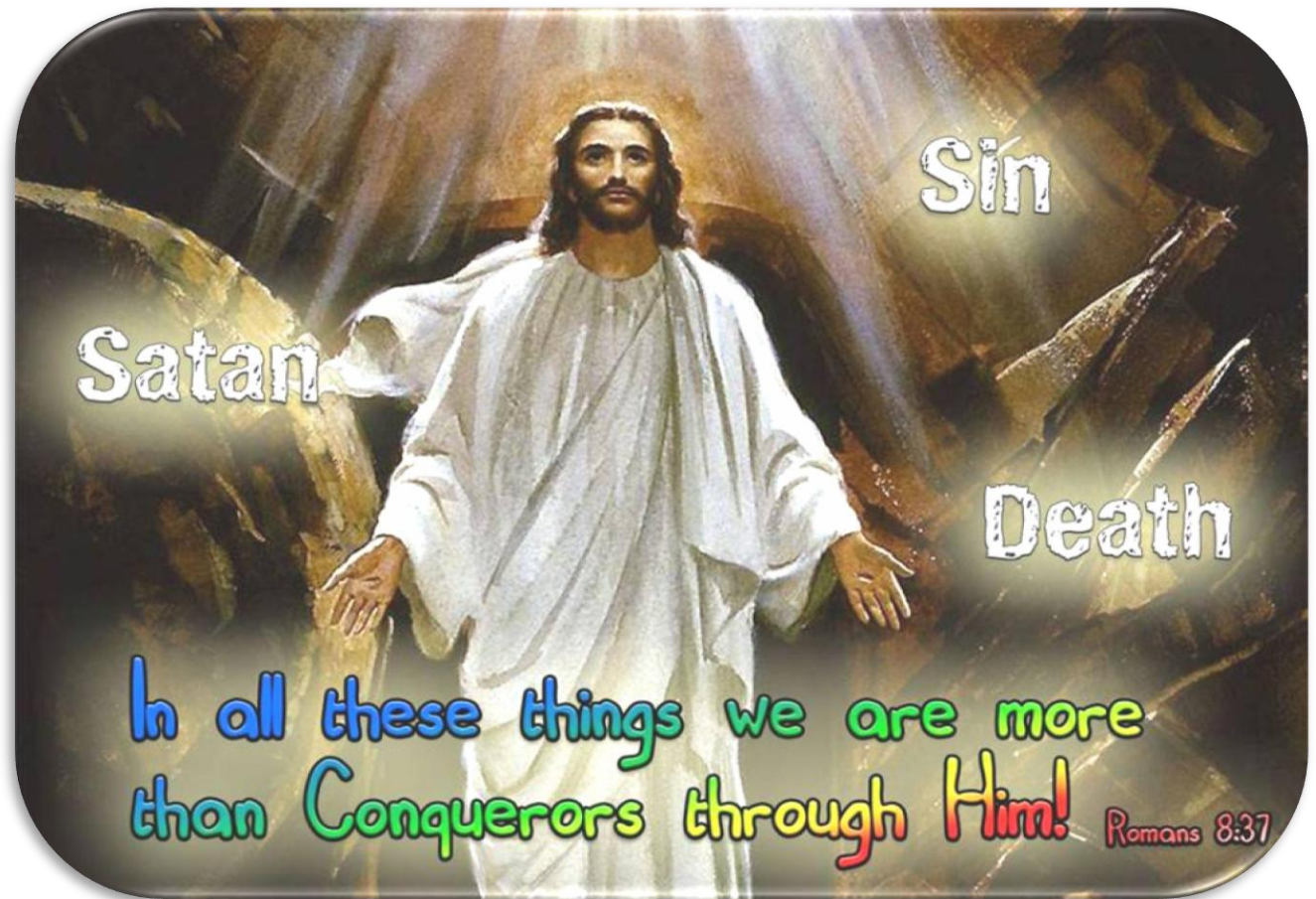

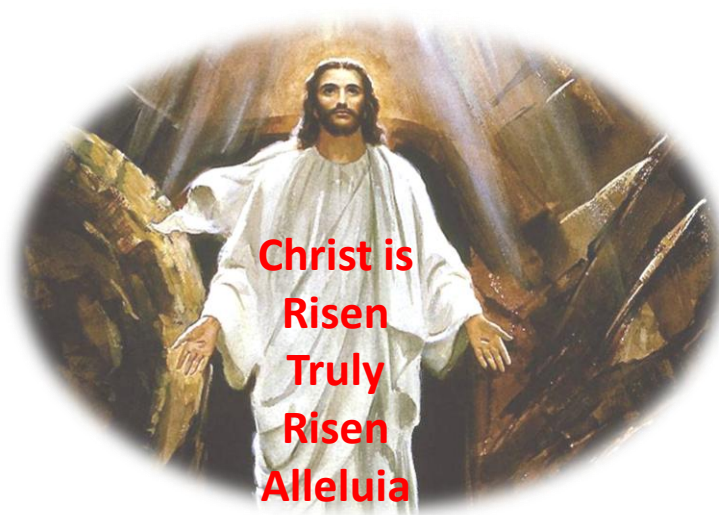

Resurrection is the central event of our salvation. Today the Church and her children rejoice for Our Lord and Savior has risen from the dead. The Resurrection is the feast of feasts. Originally the Church celebrated only one feast, the Resurrection itself, which was recalled and renewed each Sunday at the celebration of the Divine Mysteries. In the Maronite tradition, the solemnity of the Resurrection of Our Lord is expressed by a special rite called the "Rite of Peace". Peace was the first word with which the Risen Lord greeted His disciples. His good news to them was, primarily, an announcement of peace. By His Resurrection, He established peace between His Father and the world, and thus brought creation back to its original destiny. Peace, was then the primary teaching that the Maronite Liturgy has retained from the great event of the Resurrection. The Rite of Peace is the rite of exaltation of the "empty" and glorious Cross, to proclaim the victory of the risen Lord, the font of our peace.

***'I am the Resurrection and the life.

The week of Resurrection is known by different names in the Maronite Liturgy: Week of the Resurrection, Easter Week, Week of Renewals, Week of weeks. However, the name most commonly applied to it is "Week of Hawareyeen." The word reinforces "purity", "white", and "justification". It refers to the angels at the empty tomb who announced His Resurrection, or to the Lord's disciples who believed in His Resurrection and thus, were clothed in "righteousness", or to the newly baptized members of the Church.

‘THE CHURCH IS YOUNG AT HEART,’ OUR HOLY FATHER POPE FRANCIS REMINDS YOUNG PEOPLE

Francis Urges Young People to Be Courageous As He Opens Pre-Synod for 2018 Synod

The Church is young at heart...

Opening the pre-synod this morning, March 19, 2018, on the Feast of St Joseph in Rome, Pope Francis noted this as he addressed more than 300 young people gathered in the Eternal City to share together ahead of this synod and whose outcomes will be taken into consider during the October synod.

It is interesting to recall that the *Maria Mater Ecclesiae* International Pontifical College, where the Pre-Synod will be held and where the Pope was this morning, received 20 years ago, on March 19, the visit of Pope St John Paul II, “great promoter of youth.”

The upcoming synod is another gesture of closeness, demonstrating the Church’s interest to listen to and to give young people an opportunity to express their concerns, to find the way of supporting them.

In his address today, Pope Francis underscored that close dialogue with younger generations is a great help.

“I invite you then, this week, to express yourselves frankly and freely,” he noted, adding: “You are the protagonists and it is important that you speak openly.”

“‘But I am ashamed, the cardinal will hear me ...’ Hear what?, he’s used to it.

The Pope assured them that their contribution will be taken seriously.

“We need you young people, living stones of a Church with a young face, but not made up, as I said: not artificially rejuvenated, but revived from within.”

“And you provoke us to get out of the logic of ‘but it’s always been like that,’ he stressed.

“And that logic, please, is a poison. It’s a sweet poison, because it calms your soul and leaves you as anesthetized and does not let you walk. To get out of the logic of ‘always has been done this way,’ to remain creatively in the wake of authentic, yet creative, Christian tradition.

The Pope repeated his recommendation that Christians read the Book of the Acts of the Apostles, citing the creativity of those men.

“Those men knew how to go on with a creativity that if we do the translation to what it means today, it frightens us!”

Pope Francis concluded, thanking them and reminding them to pray for him.

NOONDAY DEVIL

The Desert Fathers used to say that there are many devils out there to tempt and discourage us from leading a true spiritual life, but the worst of all is the "noonday" devil!

This devil is so tricky that he gets us to either work, work, work, so that we avoid dealing with our loneliness, our hurt, or our relationship with God and others, or he tricks us to be bored, restless, depressed, or despondent, so that nothing we do might bring us any joy or peace.

By either extreme, this devil succeeds and is much more effective than the ones that come at night, in darkness. The noonday devil looks at us soberly and plies us with half-truths so that we either believe that nothing matters at all and all our efforts are useless, so why waste time trying, or that we can never do enough to find peace and joy in this life.

The Desert Fathers used to call the weapon of this devil by the Greek word "acedia." In English, we would call it sloth, despondency or laziness. Thus, whether it is hyperactivity with no real purpose or meaning, or spiritual laziness with no real hope for peace or joy, the results are the same: discouragement, depression and anger, all of which are quite poisonous, but there is a remedy.

When we look around at the divisive, unhappy, restless, angry world in which we live, we know there is something terribly wrong in our world, and also in our own personal lives. The noonday devil wants us to think there is no hope, no solution, no way out. But there is a remedy.

When we love God, love properly our own self, and love others, we trick this devil, and come to know the truth that our efforts really do matter; our caring for our self and others really does change things, and our love for the God who made us really does bring us a certain peace and joy that no matter what circumstances we face, whether good or bad, we will not lose our peace and joy.

We must free ourselves then, with God's grace, from this noonday threat to our peace of mind and to our natural joy in God, and love our way out of every temptation to discouragement, despondency, and depression, knowing that love is the only true remedy for this terrible affliction. Love not only fulfills the commandments, but leads us to God himself, and once and for all, this noonday enemy is defeated and our joy and peace return.

Let this be our Lenten discipline, to love more, so that the more generous we are in loving self, others, and God, the happier we will be. Happy Lent and Happy Easter!

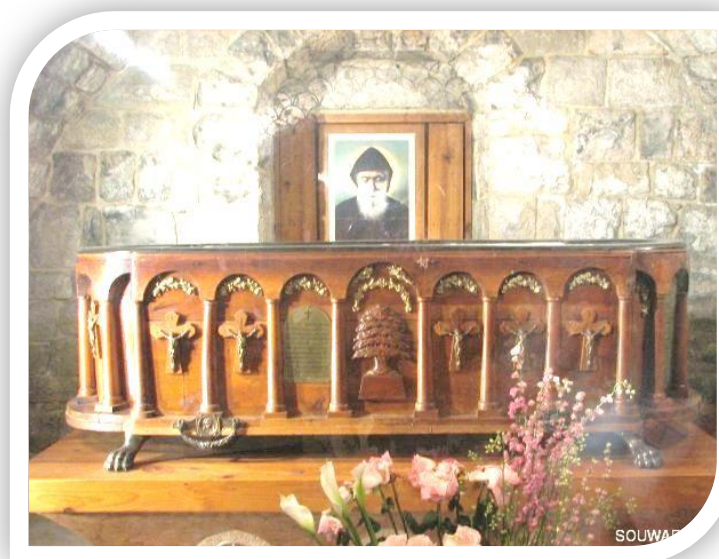
**ST. SHARBEL IN PHILIPPINES**

TURKISH AIRSTRIKES IN AFRIN DESTROY ONE OF THE OLDEST CHRISTIAN CHURCHES IN THE WORLD

St. Maron and the Julianos Church was on the UNESCO world heritage list

Warplanes of Turkish regime destroyed the archaeological site of Brad to the south of Afrin city in northern Aleppo.

General Director of Syria's Antiquities and Museums Mahmoud Hamoud told SANA that the Turkish raids on the archaeological site on Wednesday led to the destruction of many important archaeological buildings, including the tomb of St. Maron and the Julianos Church, one of the oldest Christian churches in the world which was built at the end of the 4th century AD.



The site is home to many Byzantine churches and monasteries, as well as a temple, a bath, houses, mills and a cemetery, all dating back to the Roman era during the 2nd and 3rd centuries AD.



Hamoud urged “the international organizations concerned which registered these sites on their lists to do their moral and human duty to condemn the Turkish aggression on the sites of the Syrian heritage and expose it to the world.”

In 2011, the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) listed Brad site on the World Heritage List.

Since the beginning of its assault on Afrin city, Turkish forces have vandalized a number of archaeological sites in the area.

OUR MARONTIE CATHOLIC EASTER (WEEK OF HAWAREYEEN) WEEK OF APPARITION OF OUR LORD

The *Vigil of Easter* is the night before Easter spent in prayers and praises of the Resurrected Christ, and was the perfect time to restore the backsliders to faith and administer Baptism to new catechumens who prepared themselves during all Lent with prayer and fasting. Our Maronite Church shares this tradition with the Roman Catholic Church. This is a common heritage for all Eastern and Western Churches. However, one of the most important ceremonies and celebrations was the celebration of Easter at Midnight, the first hour of the day.

The ceremony of Easter is the Rite of Peace. Jesus Christ is the King of Peace. By His Death and His Resurrection he brought peace to earth. Saint Paul wrote in his letter to the Romans:

"Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have gained access (by faith) to this grace in which we stand, and we boast in hope of the glory of God. Not only that, but we even boast of our afflictions, knowing that affliction produces endurance, and endurance, proven character, and proven character, hope, and hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the holy Spirit that has been given to us" (Romans 5:1-5).

Today's theologians and researchers are discovering the profundity and the richness of our Eastern Tradition and they are teaching it in all western and European schools and institutions of Philosophy and Theology... I hope that this brief description and explanation of the theology and the spirituality of the Maronite Church all through the Holy Week will increase in your hearts the love of the Church and participation in all her ceremonies, liturgies and prayers of this blessed week. I hope that you understand better why this week is so important, and why it is necessary to learn more and more about our Maronite Tradition and our Eastern Catholic Churches. The more you discover the richness of our Syriac Tradition, the more you will love your Church, and the more you will be proud to belong to the Eastern Churches.

For the first time on television, the animated series brought to life the characters from the classic X-Men comic books. One episode animates to life the popular mutant superhero Nightcrawler, who many don't know is a devout Catholic.

In the 44th episode of the animated series, entitled "Nightcrawler," the X-Men Gambit, Rogue, and the Wolverine take a ski trip to Germany. While Gambit and Rogue are enjoying their time together and relaxing, the Wolverine is restless and longs for some action. He hears rumors that a demon is hiding within a local monastery in town; however, when he investigates he finds not a demon, but a fellow mutant who despite his devilish appearance is a philosophical and pious Catholic.

Kurt Wagner, known as Nightcrawler, is a deeply religious man who even studied for the priesthood despite never being ordained. In the episode, he is a monk living inside a monastery, because the townspeople fear his appearance and have mistaken him for a demon. An ensuing argument between the X-Men and Nightcrawler spark the townspeople to attack them, and in the crossfire the monastery burns down. However, the X-Men convince the townspeople not to fear what they don't understand, and the episode ends with the famous Wolverine praying in a French cathedral, having found his faith again.

Vatican approves process to make Archbishop Teofilo Camomot a saint

CEBU CITY — The Vatican's Congregation for the Causes of Saints has approved the diocesan process for the cause of sainthood of the late Cebuano Archbishop Teofilo Camomot who was known for his extreme generosity and love for the poor.

In a letter addressed to the Cebu Archdiocese dated Nov. 9, Angelo Cardinal Amato said the inquiries and affidavits of witnesses gathered by the archdiocese on the life, virtues, and holiness of Camomot were valid and legitimate.

Amato is the prefect of the congregation that oversees the complex process that leads to canonization. Fr. Mhar Vincent Balili, vice postulator of Camomot's cause, hopes to begin the next step of the process, which is to prove that the late archbishop possessed heroic virtues that will give the bishop the title "venerable."

"We're very happy that the congregation approved what we are doing. We were not asked to change anything nor add something to it. Everything is good," Balili told the Inquirer.

According to him, the diocesan process includes gathering of documents and writings of Camomot as well as the testimonies of witnesses who had personal encounters with the archbishop.

"The first stage involves the creation of a tribunal, the theological committee, and the historical committee. The tribunal gathered the testimonies of witnesses. The historical committee gathered all the writings which was analyzed by the theological committee," he explained.

Balili said they ended the diocesan process last March and submitted everything to Rome in April.

"We got the results this month. That means, it took seven months for the congregation to approve it. Seven months is very, very fast already," he said.

Balili is on top of the cause of sainthood for Camomot. He collaborates with the Rome-based postulator Fr. Samson Silloriquuez.

The next part, he said, would be the preparation of the Positio, which would summarize the life and virtues of Camomot. The Positio includes the biography of Camomot, the testimonies of witnesses, and explanation why the late archbishop should be declared a saint of the Catholic Church.

When the Positio is finished, it will be submitted to the Congregation for the Causes of Saints in Rome. It will be studied by theologians and then passed to the cardinal members of the congregation who in turn will vote.



Their votes will determine whether the cause will continue or end. If the vote is affirmative, the recommendation of a Decree of Heroic Virtues is sent to the Pope.

Once the candidate's heroic virtues have been recognized by the Pope, Camomot will be called "venerable."

"From there, we wait for one miracle so that he will become a blessed. And once he becomes a blessed, we will wait for another miracle to become a saint," Balili said.

Balili called on the people to keep praying for the cause of sainthood of Camomot.

"We also ask the people to disseminate information about the sanctity of Archbishop Camomot so that more people will pray and receive favors through his intercession," he said.

It was the Daughters of St. Teresa, a religious congregation which Camomot founded, which earlier petitioned for the opening of a cause for beatification and canonization of the Cebuano archbishop.

On Oct. 15, 2010, Ricardo Cardinal Vidal, then the archbishop of Cebu, announced that the Holy See had approved the opening of the cause for Camomot's beatification and canonization. A diocesan inquiry was then made.

Since the cause for sainthood was started for Camomot, the late archbishop has been called a "Servant of God."

Camomot, fondly known as Monsignor Lolong, was known for his exceptional love for the poor.

In some instances, the Carcar City native pawned his episcopal ring and pectoral cross (the large crucifix worn by bishops) and gave the proceeds to the poor. The archbishop would also give away whatever he had to the needy.

Camomot died in a vehicular accident in San Fernando town on Sept. 27, 1988. He was 74.

The Archdiocese of Cebu ruled that the heroic virtues demonstrated by Archbishop Camomot are worthy of sainthood.

If his cause for sainthood will be approved by the Pope, Camomot will become the Philippines' third saint next to San Lorenzo Ruiz de Manila and San Pedro Calungsod – both lay persons.
