READING: 1 Corinthians 2:1-10

GOSPEL: John 14:21-27

“If anyone loves Me, he will obey My teaching. My Father will love him and we will come to Him and make our home with Him... All this I have spoken while still with you. But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit whom the Father will send in My Name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I have told you.” (John 14:23, 26)

Jesus promised His disciples that He will send them God’s Spirit, the Spirit of truth. He even explained that if it was a good thing for them that He was leaving them, but He was not leaving them alone; He would send the other messenger, the Holy Spirit, the Paraclete.

“I will give you another helper.” (Jn 14:16) Jesus refers to the Holy Spirit whom He calls the Paraclete. This Greek word has several meanings, but the general meaning is that of “Helper”. The Spirit helps the believers and inspires their prayers so that they may be heard (Rom 8:26). I will give you another Helper (or Interpreter). The Spirit enables us to understand and interpret the Gospel throughout all time. Now is the time for the disciples to make their own experience with the other Helper, and to discover His gifts and power as they discover the power of the first messenger of Jesus Christ.

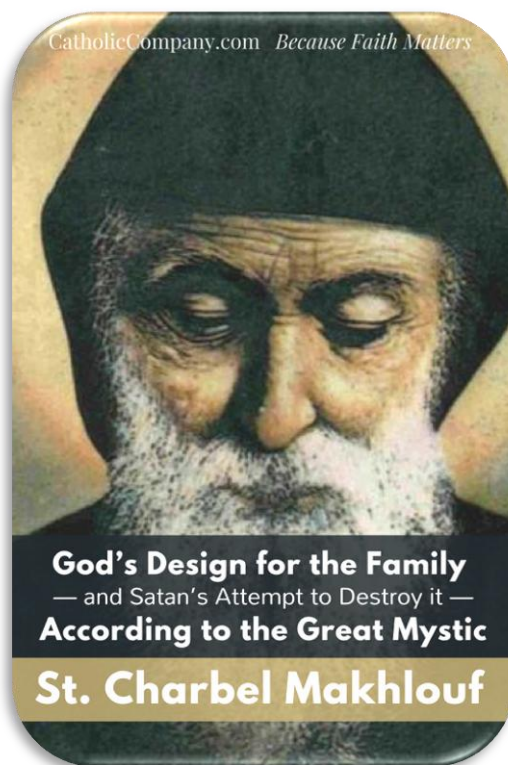

DUBLIN 2018: OUR HOLY FATHER POPE FRANCIS GRANTS PLENARY INDULGENCE TO FAMILIES

Decree of the Apostolic Penitentiary

Pope Francis will grant a plenary indulgence to the faithful, on the occasion of the 9th World Meeting of Families, to be held in Dublin, Ireland, from August 21-26, 2018.

The announcement was made in a Decree of the Apostolic Penitentiary on Monday, May 21, stated the Dicastery for the Laity, the Family and Life.

The Decree explains that the Plenary Indulgence is granted — under the “usual conditions (Sacramental Confession, Eucharistic Communion and prayers for the Holy Father’s intentions) — to the faithful who, with their soul detached from all sin, take part devoutly in certain functions” during the Meeting, “as well as in its solemn conclusion” in the presence of the Pope.

Those who can’t attend the event, states the document, will be able to obtain the indulgence under the same conditions if they are “spiritually united with the faithful present in Dublin, they recite the Our Father, the Creed and other prayers of devotion, to invoke from the Divine Mercy the ends indicated above, especially when the Pope’s words are diffused on television and radio.”

The last lines of the Decree point out that a “partial indulgence is granted to the faithful each time that, with a contrite heart, in the time indicated, they pray for the good of families.”

At present, some 22,000 people from 103 countries have registered for the meeting. With 28% younger than 18, this Meeting has the highest rate of young people,” states the Dicastery for the Laity, the Family and Life.

OUR MARONITE PATRIARCH CARDINAL BECHARA EL RAI NEW GOVERNMENT MUST FIGHT CORRUPTION

Maronite Patriarch Beshara Rai met Monday with President Michel Aoun at Baabda Palace, with the former urging Lebanon’s new government to “meet the challenges” facing the country, including rampant corruption.

“I appeal to all political forces to facilitate the formation of a government that will meet the challenges posed politically, economically and financially,” Rai said in televised comments following the sit-down, citing corruption as a key issue.

The current Parliament is scheduled to dissolve Monday, making way for the newly elected government to form.

Rai’s comments Monday echo a sermon he made one day previously at a public Mass in Bkirki, where he stressed the need for the new government to combat corruption.

“We are in a state of economic and financial emergency,” Rai said Sunday.

“All of the countries that supported Lebanon in the Rome, Paris and Brussels conferences are watching us, and they are waiting for officials and politicians to carry out reforms to treat this state of emergency,” the patriarch said, referring to a series of conferences in March and April that gathered monetary support for Lebanon’s economic, military and security sectors, as well as funds for coping with an influx of Syrian refugees.

Rai’s sit-down with Aoun came after the president met earlier Monday morning with Education Minister Marwan Hamadeh, who spoke in a radio interview Sunday against recent U.S. sanctions against Hezbollah, which he said might hamper the new government’s formation.

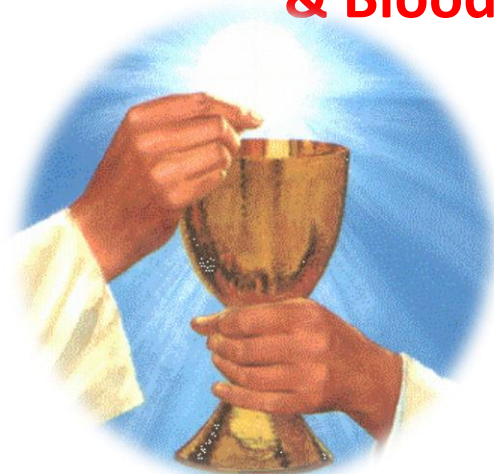
The sanctions, which target high-ranking Hezbollah members “will obstruct the formation of the government,” Hamadeh said in Sunday’s interview. Lebanon “should be distanced from political tension in order to preserve its security and stability,” the education minister added.

Corpus Christi

The Solemnity of *Corpus Christi* commemorates the institution of the Holy Eucharist, paralleling Maundy Thursday (Holy Thursday) commemorating Our Lord's institution of the Eucharist. *Corpus Christi* was introduced in the late 13th century to encourage the faithful give spiritual honor to the institution of the Holy Eucharist to the Blessed Sacrament. The official title of this Solemnity was changed in 1970 to The Body and Blood of Christ (Latin: *Sollemnitatis Sanctissimi Corporis et Sanguinis Christi*); and it is still on the Roman Missal's official Calendar for the universal Church on Thursday after Trinity Sunday; however, where it is not a day of obligation (as in the United States) it is usually celebrated on the Sunday following Trinity Sunday.

Corpus Christi became a mandatory feast in the Roman Church in 1312. But nearly a century earlier, Saint Juliana of Mont Cornillon, promoted a feast to honor the Blessed Sacrament. From early age Juliana, who became an Augustinian nun in Liège, France, in 1206, had a great veneration for the Blessed Sacrament, and longed for a special feast in its honor. She had a vision of the Church under the appearance of the full moon having one dark spot, which signified the absence of such a solemnity.

She made known her ideas to the Bishop of Liège, Robert de Thorete, to the Dominican Hugh who later became cardinal legate in the Netherlands, and to Jacques Panaléon, at the time Archdeacon of Liège and who later became Pope Urban IV. Bishop Robert de Thorete ordered that the feast be celebrated in his diocese.

Pope Urban IV later published the Bull *Transiturus* (September 8, 1264), in which, after having extolled the love of Our Savior as expressed in the Holy Eucharist, ordered the annual celebration of *Corpus Christi* on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday. More than four decades later, Pope Clement V published a new decree which embodied Urban IV's decree and ordered the adoption of the feast at the General Council of Vienna (1311). Pope John XXII, successor of Clement V, urged this observance.

The processions on *Corpus Christi* to honor the Holy Eucharist were not mentioned in the decrees, but had become a principal feature of the feast's celebration by the faithful, and became a tradition throughout Europe. These processions were endowed with indulgences by Popes Martin V and Eugene IV.

Pope Francis: Youth are lost in a 'virtual world', instead of reality

Pope Francis said Monday he is worried that youth are too enmeshed in a virtual world of cell phones and other technology, separated, in particular, from the real human contact experienced by performing works of mercy.

Answering a question about youth during a visit with the people of the Diocese of Rome May 14, the pope said that the works of mercy “help young people so much,” because they help them to be grounded in “concreteness” and to “enter into a social relationship.”

“It worries me that they communicate and live in the virtual world,” he said, noting that on a recent visit with youth, instead of extending their hands when they saw him, they “greeted” him with their phones held up, taking photos and selfies.

“Their reality is that... not human contact. This is serious,” he continued. “We have to make young people ‘land’ in the real world. Touch reality. Without destroying the good things the virtual world can have,” because some things are needed, he acknowledged. Pope Francis spoke during a visit to the cathedral of Rome, the Archbasilica of St. John Lateran, for a moment of prayer and to hear about the activities of the diocese. The encounter included Rome’s bishops, priests, religious, and members of the laity, among them representatives of the Catholic schools and various groups.

During the visit, the pope answered four questions, among them a question about young people and what he thought about the pre-synod meeting of over 300 young adults which took place in Rome in March ahead of the Synod of Bishops on young people and discernment.

He said that he had a good impression of the pre-synodal meeting and noted the participants’ hard work during the week to create the pre-synod document, which he said was “very beautiful... strong.”

The young people present “had courage to speak” and “really wanted to speak seriously,” he said.

Immediately following the Q&A, the pope gave a prepared speech, in which he spoke about what Catholics can learn from the Israelite’s exodus from slavery in Egypt to the Promised Land.

“The story of Exodus speaks of slavery, of an exit, of a passage, of an alliance, of a temptation and an entrance. But it is a journey,” he said.

The pope’s meeting with the Diocese of Rome concluded a period of reflection by the parishes and prefectures of Rome on “spiritual diseases,” which was begun during Lent.



“As you will have understood, I am inviting you to undertake another stage of the journey of the Church of Rome,” he said. “In a certain sense a new exodus, a new departure, which renews our identity as God’s people, without regrets for what we must leave.”

This period of self-reflection should lead to discernment of where God is present, even “in very ordinary forms of holiness,” he said, such as those people who are already living the Gospel in friendship with the Lord.

It will also be necessary, he continued, to listen to the cry of the people, as Moses was urged to do, “knowing how to interpret, in the light of the Word of God, the social and cultural phenomena in which you are immersed.”

Reflecting on weaknesses and sharing those with others may take time, Francis said, but having done it, Catholic communities and individuals are better prepared to serve others because they have felt and experienced the “gift of mercy and fullness of life for us and for all.”

The pope explained that Christ has loved everyone and continues to love everyone, demonstrating his care for people’s lives, that they are not “creatures abandoned to their destiny and their slavery. That everything is for our conversion and for our good.”

He also stated that Catholics should understand the truth that God did not make any mistake in putting him or her in this place at this time and with these challenges, and that if they find themselves “in a condition of slavery,” it was brought about by a dependence on created things.

The journey to the Promised Land was long for the Israelites – “40 years, eh?” – but they did not get tired, he said, inviting the Catholics of Rome to “spend some time” preparing to “reach the new land that the column of cloud and fire” will reveal.

“New conditions of life and pastoral action... To no longer be afraid of what we are and of the gift we have, but to make it fruitful,” he urged.

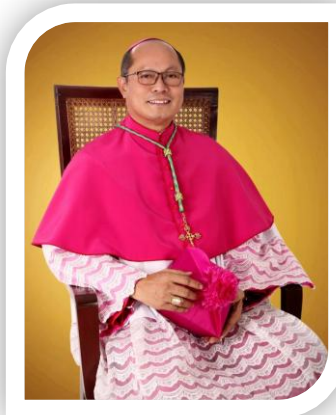

OUR HOLY FATHER POPE FRANCIS NAMES NEW BISHOP OF BAYOMBONG

Pope Francis has appointed a new bishop of Bayombong in Nueva Vizcaya.

Most. Rev. Jose Elmer Mangalinao, who is currently the Auxiliary Bishop of Lingayen-Dagupan, will take over the role from Bishop Ramon Villena who retired in 2016. A bishop for just almost two years, he will be third to head the 36-year-old diocese with more than half a million Catholics in 20 parishes.

Mangalinao grew up in Cabiao, Nueva Ecija and was ordained a priest for the Diocese of Cabanatuan in 1985. Few years after his ordination, he earned a licentiate in theology at the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome. Prior to becoming a bishop, Mangalinao was serving as the Vicar General of the Cabanatuan diocese and the president of the College of the Immaculate Conception.



Other posts he held include formator at the Maria Assumpta Seminary and parish priests at the Saint Isidore the Worker parish in Talavera town, the Three Kings parish in Gapan, and later on at the St. Nicholas of Tolentine Cathedral.

In May 2016, he was appointed Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Lingayen-Dagupan, currently headed by Archbishop Socrates Villegas.

The Catholic Church in Bayombong said a date for his installation would be announced in due course.

Archbishop appeals to avoid 'malicious insinuations' on priest's murder

A Catholic Church official is appealing for people to avoid speculation surrounding the brutal killing of Fr. Mark Anthony Ventura.

Archbishop Sergio Utleg of Tuguegarao requested that consideration be given to the impact of such speculation may be directly having on Ventura's family and friends.

As local authorities are investigating the killing from all angles, he urged the public to let the evidence come to light and let the probe take its course.

"We do not want to speculate on what the reasons are for his death. Neither do we want that the investigation be muddled by the spreading unfounded rumors and malicious insinuations," Utleg said.

The archbishop said he trusts that the police is doing its job "faithfully" in order to come out with solid evidence, arrest the killers and determine the mastermind.

"Obviously he had enemies. We do not know who they are or why they had to kill him," said Utleg.

"We hope and pray that the real truth will come out so that justice for Fr. Mark will finally be served," he said

Utleg made the statement after President Rodrigo Duterte insinuated that illicit affairs may be behind the priest's killing. In his speech before residents and local officials of Tabongon, Cebu on Sunday, Duterte also showed a matrix titled "Possible Motive (Love Triangle)" and has on it pictures of Ventura and eight women.

But the archdiocese still vouched on the Ventura's integrity, even describing him as "a dedicated priest, a zealous pastor, and missionary to the peripheries".

"He was beloved by all who knew him. He was an affectionate person, sympathetic, close and intimate to many people: rich and poor, men and women, young and old," Utleg added.

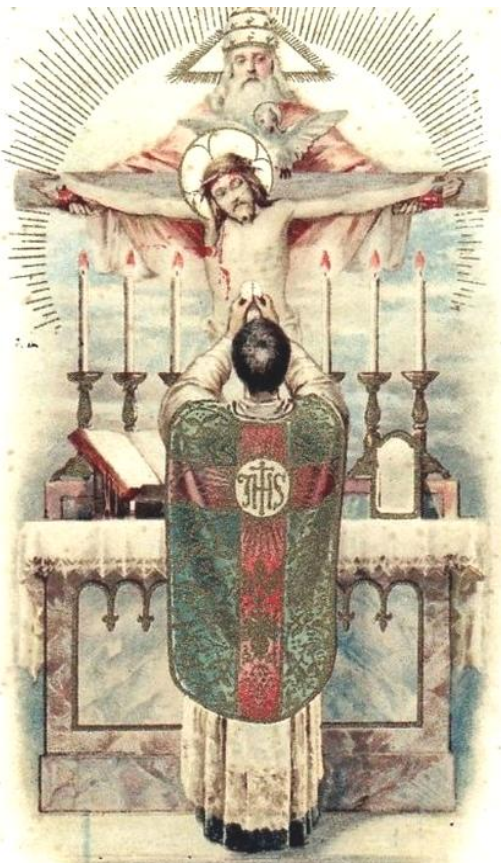
