MICHAEL L. MERRITT was born on October 1, 1951 to Oscar Leon Merritt and Lillie Judkins Merritt of Smithfield, NC. Michael was the fourth child born to his parents, and was preceded in death by two young sisters, his father Oscar L. Merrit and his mother Lillie J. Merritt. He entered into eternal rest on April 3, 2018 at the Smithfield Manor Rehabilitation Center.

Michael was educated in the Johnston County School System, Smithfield, NC and graduated from Johnston Central High in 1969. Upon graduation from high school, he enlisted in the United States Army, spending three tours in Germany. After 16 years of service, he was discharged from the military and he returned to Smithfield.

Michael was a longtime member of First Missionary Baptist Church, Smithfield where he served as a member of the Male Chorus, an operator of the sound system, and was the church custodian. He also volunteered for Meals on Wheels, serving the Smithfield area.

On December 10, 2009, Michael married Loni Larnetta Sanders. They were happily married and spent their time together traveling, taking walks by the Neuse River, volunteering, and taking care of the church. Through his sickness and illness, Larnetta was his driver and companion.

He leaves to love and cherish his memory: wife, Loni Larnetta Merritt, of Benson NC; a brother, Dennis Merritt (Lois) of Smithfield, NC; sister Patricia Merritt McDonald (Mack) of Selma, NC; two daughters, Tonya Merritt of Puerto Rico and Sheila Monroe of Selma, NC, 5 grandchildren, 3 nieces, one nephew, and a host of cousins and friends.
