DOYLE DAVIS BAIL BONDS

FACTS TO KNOW

<u>Revoke:</u> to make something null and void by withdrawing, recalling, or reversing it.

<u>Forfeit(s):</u> something that has been taken away or has had to be given up as a penalty for breaking a law or contract. **Penalty**, forfeit, loss, penalization, punishment, fine

THE STATEMENTS LISTED BELOW ARE TO HELP YOU UNDERSTAND THE BONDING PROCESS AND THE RESPOSIBLILTY OF EVERYONE INVOLED.

- 1. Bonds require co-signers. You as a co-signer are to collateralize the face dollar of the Bond(s) as well as any unpaid premium. You are also responsible for making sure that the Defendant (person being bonded) appears for <u>ALL</u> Court dates until the case has concluded. If they fail to appear for <u>ALL</u> Court dates and the bond(s) are forfeits by the Court you must pay the face amount of the bond(s).
- 2. Once the bond is posted, there are no refunds of any money paid on behalf of the Defendant whether charge(s) are filed or if the case(s) have been dismissed.
- 3. When the bail or bond has been made the Defendant is released to the custody of the bondsman or Surety. They are allowed out of jail until the case has been resolved. While the case(s) is still pending, there are rules that must be followed while out on bond to ensure the continued freedom as the case progresses.
 - i. The Defendant must make an appearance to the bondsman office within twenty-four (24) of being released from custody to complete necessary paperwork. FAILURE TO DO SO SHALL RESULT IN THE BOND BEING REVOKED.
 - ii. The defendant must supply all information requested, including, family members, employers, friends ect, phone number and addresses.
 - iii. The Defendant must report to bondsman office 24 hours in advance of any changes, address, telephone, employment, ect. <u>FAILURE TO DO SO SHALL RESULT IN THE</u> BOND BEING REVOKED.
 - iv. Defendant may not leave the Tulsa County or the State of Oklahoma with out the knowledge or permission of the bondsman <u>FAILURE TO DO SO SHALL RESULT IN</u> <u>THE BOND BEING REVOKED.</u>
 - v. Defendant must appear at all Court dates unless instructed by their Attorney.
 - vi. Defendant must call bondsman office after each Court date and advice them of the out come of that appearance.

Failure to abide by these rules shall result in the bondsman/Surety revoking the bond and surrendering the Defendant back into custody. NOTE: if the Defendant is surrendered back into custody by the bondsman/Surety for any reason(s), the co-signer is responsible for any expenses incurred. These statements and rules serve as addition to and in no way replace the Bail bond agreement.
