Griffith Animal Hospital offers boarding for cats and dogs for all sizes, ages, and breeds. Dogs over 20 pounds are kept in our runs. Each run has a raised platform for the dogs to sleep on. All of the runs consist of three solid walls to prevent unwanted interactions between dogs and neighboring runs. The front of the each run is chain linked for safe containment and gives our kennel staff the best visual to monitor your pet. For dogs under 20 pounds, we have a room separated from the runs. Each dog has his/her own stainless steel cage with solid walls and a grated front. These special accommodations prevent small dogs from being stressed or intimidated by the larger run's area. Cats also have a special room for boarding away from the dog kennels to keep feline boarders as calm and comfortable as possible. Each cat has his/her own steel cage with solid walls and a grated front.

All of our runs and boarding rooms are indoors and temperature controlled year round. For cats, bowls, beds, and litter boxes, are furnished for each individual. For dogs, stainless steel bowls and blankets will be provided for each individual. Food will be provided or you can bring your pet's usual food which will be fed per your instructions. Also, please bring any medications your pet is taking so they can be given to your pet during his/her stay.

All of our canine boarders are taken outside three to five times daily depending on the weather. The small dogs are individually leash walked by hand. The larger dogs are either individually leash walked by hand or are allowed to run individually in our fenced in back yard adjacent to the kennel area.

The safety and well-being of your pet are our top concerns. Boarders are not allowed to interact with one another and any illness or injuries occurring during your pet's stay will be treated immediately. All pets staying with us must also be current on their vaccinations and free from fleas and intestinal parasites. Cats are required to have had a feline distemper (FVRCP), Rabies vaccine, and leukemia vaccine within the past year. If your cat has a contagious feline disease, please let us know so special arrangements can be made to board your cat away from the rest of the other feline boarders.

Dogs are required to have had canine distemper (DA2PPC or DHLPPC), Rabies vaccine, and Bordetella (Kennel Cough) vaccine within the past year. Also, a fecal test or stool check must be performed within the past six months to insure intestinal parasites are not being spread.

All pets coming in for boarding will be checked for fleas. Any pets found with fleas will be treated at the owner's expense.
